School Garden

We asked parent Mairéad Stack about our beautiful school garden.

Where is the garden?

The garden frames the main carpark entrance to St. Patrick's N.S. Until Spring 2019 it was a barren area. It is now a beautiful pollinator-friendly garden and wildflower area and a registered site of the National Pollinator Plan.

Who created and maintains the garden?

The school, Caretakers, parents and Action Team Partnership Committee collaborated to develop a garden from two empty patches of soil outside the school car park gates. Parents designed the garden and sourced materials using the goodwill of the community. The right hand side rockery was designed to maximize benefit to our bees, butterflies and other Irish wildlife. The left hand side 'woodland and wild' side has a selection of native Irish trees such as Hawthorn and Rowan and is planted with native Irish wildflowers. Fingal County Council, parents and local businesses donated the trees and plants.

It is a fine example of how co-operation among parents, schools and a local community can create something beautiful out of nothing.

What's happening at the moment?

Each Autumn the wildflower area is cut once the flowers have gone to seed. This follows best practice guidelines and explains the 'cropped' look of the 'wild' side at present.

What can we do?

We need volunteers to help manage the garden. You don't need any experience and you don't need to know anything about plants! We need weeding volunteers to help clear both sides of unwanted plants. We can guide you and we won't mind if you dig up the wrong flower! The garden belongs to the families of the school so 'get dug in'! We welcome families planting flowers and plants also. We try to plant wildlife friendly plants.

Outdoor Classroom

Spring/Summer 2021 saw another great collaboration between the school, parents and local community for the benefit of the children. An Action Team Partnership initiative in collaboration with the Parents Association saw the addition of an "Outdoor Classroom" to St. Patrick's N.S.

Parents very generously supported a "Santa Hat Walk" last December which raised nearly €5,000 to pay for the equipment. Families willingly gave their time and skills over a number of days to create and decorate an area which incorporates an all weather green play area, seating and teaching equiment. It is beautifully decorated with a mural and planting.

The space is used by classees on a daily basis for learning and also by children at break time.

We were recently awarded €333 by the Tesco Community Fund and plan to use this to add more equiment and enhance it even further.
