FUNDRAISING

Although the Parents Association is active in many aspects of school life, we are probably most conspicuous by our fundraising activities. Through fundraising, we provide financial support to many activities and resources in the school for which no other funding exits.



The 2012/2013 school year was another great year for the PA in terms of fundraising. Some highlights include the Christmas Fair which again brought in over €20,000 thanks to the generous participation of the parents and all the sponsors without whom it would not be possible.

So where does this money go ..?

In December 2012 we contributed almost €16,000 to a variety of resources requested by the school.

• These included €4,000 which was spent on a large amount of materials for teaching science, from beakers to bug viewers, so I imagine the kids are enjoying their science classes!

 Approximately €3,500 was also spent on Math, English and Irish books also.

• Sport was not forgotten with another €2,200 on equipment and bibs.

• Of course the communion and confirmation receptions and graduation pizza party are supported by the PA, and we also organise the school photographs.



Looking forward, our goal is to continue to help reduce the financial burden on parents by supporting the book schemes in the school. This has proven to be very popular and will be the main focus of our fundraising in the coming year.

All these things add not only to the quality of education in the school, but also to the experience of school life for all our children. It is achieved through the hard work and commitment of both the PA Committee members and an army of parent volunteers who contribute a little time and energy to the various events and for that **THANK YOU**.

PARENTING TALKS



St Patrick's Parent Association strives to provide informative and relevant parenting talks that are facilitated by experts in their field. During the course of the school year 2012/2013 we hosted three talks:

In November 2012 "Positive Parenting in Challenging Times" by Sheila O Malley of Practical Parenting (www.practicalparenting.ie) took place.

Sheila had facilitated a talk for us in 2011 and returned to provide another interactive, fun and interesting talk suitable for parents with children of all ages. We achieved our highest attendance ever with this talk last year and for that reason we intend to book Sheila again this year.

In April, following huge media coverage in relation to bullying and cyber bullying in the last year, the PA booked Jennifer Ryan, MSc Forensic Psychology, Hdip Guidance and Counselling, to provide a talk titled "Lets Talk about Bullying". The purpose of this talk was to outline the definitions of bullying, types of bullying, what schools are doing to protect children, how to know if your child is bullying or being bullied, cyber bullying and what parents can do to help. The talk was well received by the parents in attendance.

In May our final talk took place. An annual booking "Transition for Primary to Post Primary" talk is aimed at parents of children in 5th and 6th class. Facilitated by Tom Casey, Teen Counsellor, Crosscare who brings a lot of relevant experience and practical advice. Feedback from parents who attended was very positive.
