The tracksuit should be worn on P.E. days and either tracksuit or uniform can be worn any other days. It is acceptable to wear the school tracksuit every day, at all class levels

Only tracksuit or uniform should be worn to school. Alternative tops/hoodies are not acceptable.

The school uniform and tracksuit are available in Happy Events in Grants Coolmine Industrial Estate and Leddy Uniform's, Blanchardstown.. Second hand uniforms are often available in the St Vincent de Paul Shop, Main St, Blanchardstown. Generics for some items (marked in red) can be purchased in many shops.

Jewellery

Wearing jewellery poses a safety risk at school because of the active nature of the school day. It is therefore necessary for us to request that children not wear earring(s) (other than studs), necklaces, bracelets and rings in school. Watches are acceptable but we would ask that they be removed during PE classes. Smart watches are not allowed under the school's Digital Usage Policy. Fitbits and other similar watches can only be worn if camera, message and phone functions are fully switched off for the duration of school hours.

Make up

Children in primary school are children and do not need to wear makeup to school. The wearing of makeup, false eyelashes, fake tan or false nails is not permitted. The wearing of makeup may create a pressure on other children which we wish to avoid in school. If a child wears make up to school, the following steps will apply:

- 1. Teacher will remind pupil makeup is not permitted
- 2. If child wears makeup to school again, a written reminder will be sent home with child to be signed by parent
- 3. If a child persists in wearing makeup, the Principal will be informed and parents will be asked to meet with Principal
